The AI in Health and Care Award will deploy £140m over four years to accelerate the testing and evaluation of the most promising AI technologies that meet the strategic aims set out in the NHS Long Term Plan.

The award is separated into phases, from one to four. Phases one and two have been completed successfully and phases three and four are now open, focusing on scaling This briefing document is intended for those who may want to apply for this grant with the support of TheHill.

up more technologies into the NHS and care systems. Al technologies funded through the award can have a variety of applications in health and social care and may come under the broad categories of:

- » Phase 2: Development & clinical evaluation
- » Phase 3: Real world testing
- » Phase 4: Initial health system adoption

Phase 3 and 4 applicants are particularly welcomed if submitting proposals within the following focus areas:

- Self-management of long term conditions
- Diagnostic support
 - Improving operational/ system efficiency
- Supporting elective recovery

Applications are open to SMEs, NHS or social care organisations or service providers, higher education institutions, charities and local authorities.

You may only apply to one phase per product.
